

LEADERSHIP: A Professional Development Workshop

In addition to the faculty roles of research, teaching and service to the university, an important role that can be a significant contribution of faculty is **leadership in the various disciplines and professions** they represent. Such professional leadership is important in contributing to the nature and directions that the scholarly disciplines take which influences the content and directions of the education in those disciplines promulgated by the university. It can also enhance the reputation of the university in the wider scholarly community. Many faculty receive little experience in professional development during their graduate education and are generally on their own in developing avenues of influence within their field.

The workshop will be directed by Professor Frank Farley of CEHD who has exceptionally wide experience in leadership in the professions of education, psychology and the social sciences. The workshop will cover such features of professional success as effective leveraging of one's scholarly expertise, calibrating one's trajectory of professional engagement, the importance of willingness to volunteer, the power of yes, time commitment, collaboration, being a joiner, conventioning, thought leadership, the power of media and name recognition, being a founder, and more.

This interactive workshop will be open to all interested CEHD faculty and doctoral students. It may be of particular interest to early-career faculty, and will be conducted virtually via Zoom for two hours. Follow-up individual consultations of participants with Dr. Farley will be available.

Biography:

Dr. Frank Farley is Canadian born and raised with two degrees from the University of Saskatchewan, and a PhD from the Institute of Psychiatry, University of London, UK. He subsequently emigrated to the U.S., where he has taught at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, University of California-Berkeley, Temple University, and has been a visiting scholar at Stanford University. Dr. Farley is currently the President-Elect for the Society for the History of Psychology, and has formerly served as President of 14 other professional organizations, including the American Psychological Association (APA), the American Educational Research Association (AERA), the International Council of Psychologists, the Society for General Psychology, and the Society for Experimental Psychology and Cognitive Science. He currently serves as a board member of the Society for Media Psychology and Technology and the Elwyn Foundation, and Chairman of the Board of Directors for Elwyn New Jersey. He has also previously served on the board of eight other organizations, including the Eastern Psychological Association, the Society for the Scientific Study of Sex, and the Federation of Associations in Behavioral and Brain Sciences. Dr. Farley has been elected a Fellow of the following scholarly societies: American Association for the Advancement of Science, New York Academy of Sciences, American Psychological Association (as well as its Divisions 1,3,10,15,16,24,27,32,46,52), Association for Psychological Science, American Educational Research Association, Psychonomics Society, Canadian Psychological Association, Midwestern Psychological Association, Eastern Psychological Association, Society for the Scientific Study of Sex, International Association of Applied Psychology.
